- LGBTQIA+ History Month is a month-long celebration that occurs in October to observe lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer history. LGBTQIA+ History Month was first celebrated in the United States in 1994, centering on National Coming Out Day, which occurs annually on October 11th. This celebratory month was originally known as Lesbian and Gay History Month, and additional identity acronyms were added over time to increase inclusivity of LGBTQIA+ communities.
- Since 2015, October is recognized worldwide as Dyslexia Awareness Month. Dyslexia Awareness Month was created to raise awareness and share stories, resources and tools to increase better reading skills.
- October was first designated as Down Syndrome Awareness Month in the 1980s and has been recognized every October since. Down Syndrome Awareness Month celebrates people with Down Syndrome and makes others aware of their abilities and accomplishments.
- October also marks Italian-American Heritage Month. Italian-American Heritage Month celebrates the culture, achievements and many contributions of Italian-Americans in the United States.
